

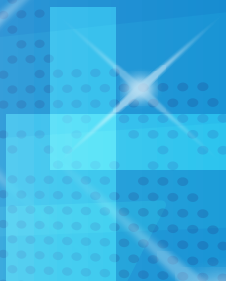

The UNODC-KOSTAT Centre of Excellence for Statistics on Crime and Criminal Justice in Asia and the Pacific (CoE) is a joint project between United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC) and Statistics Korea (KOSTAT). The CoE was established in February 2019, and is based in Daejeon, Republic of Korea.

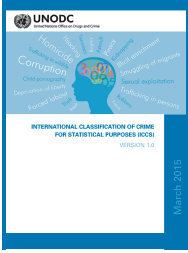
The CoE is a regional innovation hub for the exchange of knowledge, experience, and information between stakeholders involved in the production, collection, analysis, and dissemination of crime and criminal justice data as the basis for evidence-based policymaking.

The CoE provides and organizes technical assistance and training activities to support regional Member States to improve statistical methodologies and technical capabilities.

Particular focus is given to promoting, adopting, and implementing the International Classification of Crime for Statistical Purposes (ICCS), crime victimization surveys, corruption surveys, increasing the availability and quality of data provided to the UN-Crime Trends Surveys (UN-CTS), and supporting the production of data indicators required to monitor relevant Sustainable Development Goals in the areas of crime, violence, trafficking, access to justice and rule of law (SDGs 3, 5, 11, 15 and 16).



What tools does UNODC provide?



International Classification of Crime for Statistical Purposes (ICCS)

The ICCS provides common definitions of crimes which enhance the accuracy, comparability, and consistency of crime and criminal justice data, regardless of the data producer and time.

The 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development

By producing reliable crime and criminal justice data, countries can produce statistics for the 16 UNODC SDG indicators in the areas of crime, violence, trafficking, access to justice and rule of law.



Global Data Collections

UNODC tools include the Annual Report Questionnaire (ARQ), the Individual Drug Seizures (IDS), and crime and criminal justice global data collection tools, the **United Nations Survey of Crime Trends**

and Operations of Criminal Justice Systems (UN-CTS), **Illicit Arms Flows Questionnaire (UN-IAFQ, 'Firearms')** and the **Questionnaire for the Global Report on Trafficking in Persons (GLOTIP)**. The collected data are analyzed and disseminated on the **Global Data Portal**. It provides an overview of crime data by crime and country.



Surveys

Tools are supplemented by surveys. **Crime Victimization Surveys (CVS)** expose the gap between administrative data and the actual crime level, known as 'dark figure of crime'. **Corruption Surveys (CS)** assist Governments to understand and respond to personal and business experiences of bribery, to enhance responses and increase trust in public institutions.



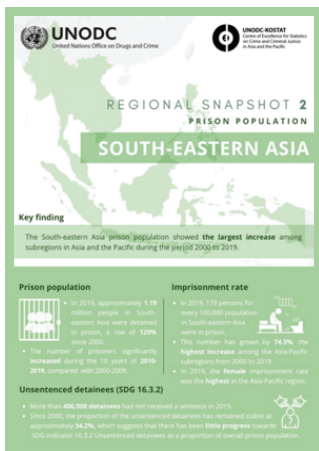
